SAFETY & WELLNESS

1. SNAP (Student Access Neighborhood Program)

Check out www.snapforschools.com or go to the school's website and look under "School Information" and then "Safety" to review the safe walking and bussing plan. We have recommended the safest walking plan for students. We also encourage students to walk in groups. Crossing guards are provided at key intersections. Students riding the bus will load and unload on the North side of the school. Parent drop off and pick up is on the East side of the school.

2. INCLEMENT WEATHER POLICY

Air Quality

Listed below are air quality guidelines from the Utah Department of Health "Recess Guidance for Schools."

- o ***When the Particulate Matter (PM2.5) level is between 35.5 and 55.4 that "sensitive students" should be accommodated to avoid outdoor recess.***

- o **When the PM2.5 level is between 55.5 and 90, "sensitive" students and those students experiencing respiratory symptoms should avoid outdoor recess.**
- o **When the PM2.5 level is 90 or higher, recess should be moved indoors for all students.**
- o At any time, you can refer to www.airquality.utah.gov, under current conditions, to review the current PM2.5.
- o Please note that schools do not determine which students are considered sensitive. Parents need to communicate to schools that they would like their child kept indoors. However, please use your best judgment if a student is asking to stay indoors.
- o Please follow the guidelines issued by the UDH related to PM2.5 along with the red, yellow, and green codes that are communicated to the public. A "red day" does not necessarily indicate inside recess for all students.

Temperature

- Students will be allowed to play outdoors until the temperature reaches 20°. Other factors will be considered when determining safe temperatures Wind chill and student appropriate dress are some of the factors considered.

Rain/Snow/Wind

- Rain, lightning, wind, and other inclement weather will be considered when not allowing students to play outdoors. Snow fall will be considered safe as long as other factors such temperature, accumulation, and ice do not infract safety.

3. INTERNET SAFETY

Teachers are covering internet safety with students using the guidelines set up by Utah Netsmart.

4. LUNCH PROGRAM

Current lunch time is 45 minutes. The minimum time will be used for lunch when the school size reaches capacity. Current School Size: 708 students (max capacity is 955 students).

5. PHYSICAL FITNESS

Playground will be ready for student use by the end of the month.

6. RAD KIDS PROGRAM (Personal Empowerment Safety Education Program)

If volunteers and parents can be acquired, Colleen Warren will head up this program to start next year. The SCC is interested in continuing this program at Golden Fields if the funding and training needs can be met.

Current needs for the program:

- Parent volunteers to train as instructors for the program.
- A "Red Man" (a pretend stranger). Possible candidate for this role: Danny Soulier
- Funding! The equipment and training costs for this program is high. We will consider allocating some of the Land Trust Fund monies.
