Three times a year, beginning in the next two weeks, students in 3rd-6th grades will participate in several exercises to better understand these concepts and to reflect on how they perceive these skills in themselves.

We will be asking for your child to reflect on their own mindsets and approaches to learning via an online survey they will be completing at school. The survey shouldn't take more than 15-30 minutes to complete.

The survey content will ask students to self-reflect on their ability to self regulate their emotions, their sense of belonging at school, and their sense of self-efficacy regarding academic content.

We are asking that all of our students participate in the surveys, as their responses will provide invaluable insights into their experiences and how we can improve and adapt our district to their needs. If a student doesn't feel like they have enough information to answer a question, they will be able to skip the item altogether. The responses to these surveys will be completely confidential. We are partnering with a third-party vendor to support us in administering these surveys.
